#### **CHARACTER BASICS**

- Age For our show, it can be any age.
- Gender For our show, it can be either a man or woman.

#### **BEYOND THE BASICS**

- Video Location Record this video from a "home" location, as if using a webcam.
- Costumes Be creative and tasteful.

#### **DIRECTOR NOTE (DN)**:

Record this video from a "home" location, as if using a webcam. This is Romeo and Juliet falling in love. The famous balcony scene (shortened and done online)
